Annual UP Campus Bird Census – 21 October

Arrie Kloppers organised this annual bird count which was conducted at LC de Villiers Sports Campus and the information supplied to the relevant UP departments.

The joint UP - BLNG event had a record crowd in attendance. Hope we can build on this momentum.

We divided into three groups to survey the Hartbeesspruit that runs through the Hillcrest campus. One team surveyed the dam the LC de Villiers Sports Centre and had the unenviable task to count the birds in the herony. One team surveyed the area along the spruit between the two dams and the third team surveyed the Uitspandam and the spruit below that.

All teams recorded similar numbers of species (± 50) but the team at the sport centre had their work cut out for them and recorded 675 birds in total. The combined list of 78 species, 1194 birds, made for a great morning outing in the middle of the city.



The Little Bittern that showed at the Uitspandam stands out as one of the highlights, followed by the African Harrier-Hawk. Overall, just a great morning's birding experience.

Groenkloof NR – 29 Oktober



Oktober, die mooiste, mooi maand, as jakarandas Suid Afrika met 'n pers lappieskombers oortrek. Hierdie jaar is die bome besonder groen na die milde reën vroeër die jaar. Groen en goud. Dis heel week al hittig in Gauteng en die weerkaarte voorspel wolke. Ons sien uit na die koelheid maar wonder hoe 'n vlaag reën die lang stap in Groenkloof ons gaan demp.

Sondagoggend vroeg begin die voertuie voor die hek in gelid saam kom. Die Tortelduiwe oefen koor en die Langstertjies (Prinias) dirigeer die orkes met Jan Frederik (Cape Robin-Chat) en Lyster (Thrush) wat op tyd inval. Terwyl ons die register teken, flits vrolike Glasogies (Cape White-eye) heen en weer oor ons koppe, gretig om hulle fyn tril by die koor te voeg, met die Swartooogtiptolle (Dark-capped Bulbul) se vrolike sinnetjies daarby.




Rooibeklyster [Mariana Arnoldi]

Elmarie gewaar 'n Piet-my-vrou (Red-chested Cuckoo) en almal is dadelik by met hul glasoë. Sowaar, oop en bloot sit die koekoek, almal kan na hartelus kyk, en bokant hom sit nog een. Soe, almal is opgewonde, want die skugter skelms is gewoonlik goed versteek. Die Swartsperwer (Black Sparrowhawk) rond die koor af met sy dagbreeklied.

Ons stap verder na die groot moerbeiboom waar al die spesies meeding vir 'n happie. Muisvoëls – Rooiwang en Gevlek (Red-faced - and Speckled Mousebirds), Kwevoël (Grey Go-away-bird), Rooi- en Geelbeklysters (Karoo – and Kurrichane Thrush), en Suidelike Waterfiskaal (Southern Boubou) duet al om ons. Teen die randjie sing die Bonthoutkapper (Acacia Pied Barbet) aanhouwend, maar word stilgemaak deur die Bosveldfisant (Swainson's Francolin). Ons stap aan en soek die Paradysvlieëvanger (Paradise Flycatcher) wat ook nie op hom laat wag nie.


James sien 'n roofvoël oorvlieg en almal skarrel om hom in hul visiere te kry – 'n Bruinjakkalsvoël, soos Amanda hom later identifiseer. 'n Volstruismannetjie tel sy vlerke dreigend op – sowaar, daar is 'n kleintjie by sy pote! Mariana roep uit dat daar 'n Bokmakierie is, en almal kry hom darem te siene. Mooi! Tussen die digter bome verras 'n Swartkatakoeroe (Black Cuckooshrike) se sang ons, en ons is baie bly dat sy wyfie mooi oop gaan sit. En net daar vlieg 'n groterige swart voël met wit in sy lang stert uit- tot Danie hom later uitken as Gestreepte Nuwejaarsvoël! (Levaillant's Cuckoo). Die reën het weggebleef, en ons kom terug by die parkeerarea, met 75 spesies op ons lys.
